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DISPENSATIONS :- U.I.C. TYPE DOUBLE LINK SUSPENSION, AUXILIARY SUSPENSION RUBBERS, BEARING SPRINGS.

1. U.I.C. Type Suspension

1.1 The allowable wear on the link (Item 1 on Drg. No. UIC 3.02.00.01) to be increased from 1mm to 2mm per wearing face, viz.,

A.A', Drg. R.C.H. 3130, Limit of Wear increased to 2mm i.e. minimum diameter 23mm.

1.2 The allowable wear on the intermediate link (Item 3 on Drg. No. UIC 3.02.00.03) to be increased from 1.5mm to 2.5mm per wearing surface viz.,

D-D' Drg. R.C.H. 3130 increased from 1.5mm to 2.5mm i.e. maximum distance between worn surfaces increased from 63 to 65mm.

- 1.3 It is emphasized that the maximum overall distance between the auspension link pin centres, i.e. 303mm must not be exceeded.
- 1.4 Individual components of the suspension may be replaced as necessary, when the maximum wear limits have been reached.
- 1.5 Limits (Overall), of Components on same spring.
- 1.6 The overall difference in total length of suspension link pin centres on one spring, should not exceed 3mm, See Fig. 1, i.e. $x_1 x_2 = 3mm$.
- 1.7 The overall length of the two suspension link pin centres on one end of a spring, should be equal. See Fig. 2 i.e. $y_1 & y_2$ should be equal.
- 1.8 The difference of the average suspension link pin centres, each side of the wheelset, i.e. z_1 & z_2 should be checked, and it is desirable that the difference should not exceed 6mm. See Fig. 3.

2. Eyebolt Suspension

2.1 Defective robber springs can be replaced on a "ONE FOR ONE" basis, instead of the complete set, as is the present practice.

3. General

3.1 It must be clearly understood that the above dispensations can only be applied to P.O. Wagons working in the U.K., and NOT to 1/ any wagons used on continental workings.
